GAWB is inviting Gladstone primary school students to 'reimagine our water future' and create a poster that highlights the important of saving water today and every day.

GAWB Chief Executive Officer, Darren Barlow, said five lucky winners would be chosen from the entries received.

"We're asking our region's primary school students to design a simple poster that shares their ideas for saving water at home, school or in the community," Mr Barlow said.

"The individual winners of our National Water Week Poster Competition will receive a prize pack valued at \$100, along with a bonus cash grant for their school.

"It's up to all of us to use water wisely and protect our local waterways, so how can we reimagine the way we use and reuse water in our daily lives?"

Paper and digital poster entries are welcome. Any art material or digital material can be used, including paint, textas, coloured pencils, collage materials, original photographs and digital graphics.

"The only limit is your imagination," Mr Barlow said.
